The standard membership fee is made up of the full annual subscription, the Research and Education levy and the Faculty or Chapter levy. Reduced or other fee types may apply, as described below.

Fellows must apply in writing for a reduced subscription on the grounds of financial hardship. 2. Permanently retired or doctors temporarily not working for 12 months or more OR practising less than two weeks a year, eg maternity leave, VSA, etc. 5. Doctors absent from NZ for more than 12 months and not enrolled in the College's CPD programme. Advise the College if you are non-resident for GST purposes and your invoice will be GST exclusive. 6. Doctors not currently working in general practice or enrolled in CPD or other College programmes, but who are employed in another aligned scope of practice. 7. Regional Faculty levy does not apply in the first year of joining. 8. Part-year subscription fees

Subscriptions are pro-rated if you join the College or resign part way through our financial year (April to March).

Membership is continuous until you formally resign your membership. Should you resign, all outstanding fees, dues and levies must be paid.

Membership Categories

The College has four membership categories:

Fellow (FRNZCGP/FDRHMNZ)

Fellows have successfully completed all College Fellowship assessment requirements and have satisfied the College of their competence through training and/or experience. Fellows have full voting rights and are entitled to use the designation FRNZCGP (Fellow of the College) and/or FDRHMNZ (Fellow of the Division of Rural Hospital Medicine).

Member

Members have successfully completed the GPEP Clinical and Written Examinations at the end of the General Practice Education Programme Year 1, or an equivalent overseas programme. Members have full voting rights.

Associate in Training

Associates in Training (registrars) are New Zealand-registered doctors who are currently undergoing the General Practice Education Programme or the Division of Rural Hospital Medicine Training Programme. Associates in Training may take part in College affairs, but have no voting rights.


Associate in Practice

Associates in Practice are New Zealand-registered doctors who are engaged in general practice or rural hospital medicine or other aligned scope of practice. They must comply with all Medical Council (MCNZ) requirements for aspects of their practice that are not within the scope of New Zealand general practice. Associates in Practice may take part in College affairs, but have no voting rights.

The College Structure

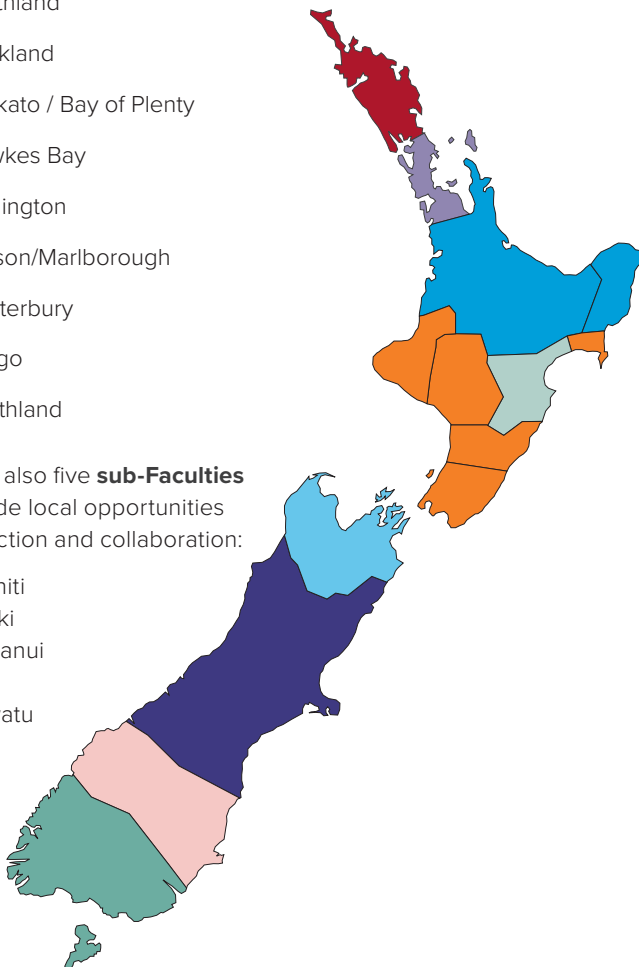
Faculties

College Faculties are based on geographical areas and allow members to be involved in discussion and decision-making at a regional level. The nine Faculties from north to south are:

-  Northland
-  Auckland
-  Waikato / Bay of Plenty
-  Hawkes Bay
-  Wellington
-  Nelson/Marlborough
-  Canterbury
-  Otago
-  Southland

There are also five **sub-Faculties** that provide local opportunities for connection and collaboration:

1. Tairāwhiti
2. Taranaki
3. Whanganui
4. Wairoa
5. Manawatu



All College members are automatically assigned to a regional Faculty and will receive information about Faculty activities directly.

Chapters

Unlike Faculties, Chapters are optional groups of members that revolve around major national areas of practice. The four Chapters are:

1. **Pacific Chapter** made up of members who identify as Pasifika, or members who serve communities with large Pacific populations or who are interested in Pacific health issues. Membership of this Chapter is optional.
2. **Registrars' Chapter** is made up of doctors who are enrolled in the General Practice Education Programme (GPEP) and Division of Rural Hospital Medicine (DRHM) vocational training programmes. Membership of this Chapter is optional.
3. **Rural General Practitioners' Chapter** is made up of College members who are involved in the provision of services within the scope of general practice in rural communities. Membership of this Chapter is optional.
4. **Division of Rural Hospital Medicine Chapter** – all DRHM members automatically belong to this Chapter.

Te Akoranga a Māui

Te Akoranga a Māui is the College's Māori representative group, made up of College members who self-identify as Māori and have a Māori whakapapa. Membership is optional.
