

Applications open for College Clinical Consultant - GPEP position

The Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners (the College) is welcoming applications for the role of Clinical Consultant - General Practice Education Programme (GPEP) 5/10ths. This role was formally known as Clinical Lead.

Reporting to the Head of Learning, you will provide clinical input and advice to the GPEP team, from applications to awarding Fellowship.

You will work closely with the Clinical Consultant - Assurance, Lead Medical Educators (LMEs) and College teams to ensure the GPEP is delivered according to best practice, ensuring the College can provide our registrars with a pathway to become successful general practitioners.

Key tasks:

- Provide leadership and advice to College staff and educators on clinical matters of the programme
- Maintain effective working relationships with Lead Medical Educators
- Maintain a supportive and collaborative working relationship with the Clinical Consultant – Assurance
- Maintain awareness of the GPEP assessment processes and ensure that Lead Medical Educators are knowledgeable on what is assessed and how it is assessed
- Provide advice and support to the admissions team, including interviewing applicants Work with the College's Tumuaiki and Head of Equity to drive system change within the College and its training programmes to address health inequities
- Attend, participate and provide clinical expertise to governance committees.

The successful candidate should have the following essential skills and experiences:

- Vocational registration as a General Practitioner in New Zealand
- Advanced understanding of the issues that face Māori general practitioners and health providers
- Fellowship of The Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners for a minimum of five years
- Maintain clinical general practice experience of a minimum of two tenths
- Experience as a Medical Educator or teacher in GPEP
- Expert relationship management including building and maintaining collaborative relationships
- Experience in the delivery of quality national education programmes
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Experience in using technology as an enabler for learning delivery
- Experience in effective small and large group facilitation.
